A call for support ahead of the Cathedral's 950th anniversary

The past few years have not been without their challenges: the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic; the cost-of-living crisis; and the significant increase in operational costs, to name but a few. We want to be transparent with you and share details around the trials and prospects that now face us — details can be found in a separate booklet.

Reflecting upon our history, we have noted how — in successive generations and in the aftermath of national and local crises — individuals have renewed the Cathedral's life through selfless acts of service and through generous giving. In each period, the hopeful message of Resurrection — of the unconquerable and transformative power of God's love — has been at the heart of our vision, with the Cathedral as a beacon for this good news at the heart of the city and diocese.

This has encouraged us to reflect, with hope, upon our purpose in this generation. Rooted in our Vision (which we presented in 2022/3) and looking towards 2025 (the year in which we mark 950 years since the decision was made to establish a cathedral in Chichester, relocating the seat of the diocese from the town of Selsey) and beyond, we ask you to consider extending your support for the Cathedral's renewal:

1) Through making a donation — We ask for our congregation to make a gift through the Parish Giving Scheme — a simple and secure way for churches to receive gifts by Direct Debit, Credit and Debit Cards, Apple and Google Pay methods. As we approach 2025, you may wish to consider increasing your donation to £9.50 a week.

The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'

THE NICENE CREED



and for her life he died.


Elect from every nation,
