- There are still places available on the 2025 retreat... The Rev Dr Earl Collins has kindly agreed to lead the Lent Retreat at Douai Abbey in Berkshire. The retreat will run from 4pm on Thursday 6 March 2025 to 2pm on Sunday 9 March 2025. The theme will be The Mystery of Christ. Christ as the revelation of God's Mystery is a key notion in the New Testament. This retreat will focus on how the Mystery was revealed in the main events of Christ's life and work. In each session we will look at three dimensions: the witness to the Mystery in Scripture, how the Church celebrates it in worship and what it means for the life and prayer of each Christian individually. The aim will be to contemplate Christ in his saving work, so as to draw closer to God. Sessions will focus on the baptism of Christ, the Transfiguration, the Paschal Mystery, the Ascension and the Eucharist. The retreat will cost approximately (prices to be confirmed nearer the time) £ 250 plus VAT per person for a single room and £205 plus VAT per person for a shared room, for full board for the three nights. The Cathedral is unable to provide transport to the Abbey but may be able to help to arrange car shares. - **Baptism and Confirmation**: if you are an adult and would like to be baptised or confirmed at Easter (or to discuss the possibility of this if you are unsure), please speak to one of the clergy about preparation.
- Carpet: whilst we are exploring longer term plans, we are looking for a carpet of possibly a reddish colour and classic design for the nave sanctuary. It would need to be approximately 3 metres by 4 metres. If you think you might have something suitable, the Dean would be very pleased to hear from you.
