BLESSED BY YOUR GIFTS

A call for support ahead of the Cathedral's 950th anniversary

The past few years have not been without their challenges: the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic; the cost-of-living crisis; and the significant increase in operational costs, to name but a few. We want to be transparent with you and share details around the trials and prospects that now face us – details can be found in a separate booklet.

Reflecting upon our history, we have noted how - in successive generations and in the aftermath of national and local crises - individuals have renewed the Cathedral's life through selfless acts of service and through generous giving. In each period, the hopeful message of Resurrection - of the unconquerable and transformative power of God's love - has been at the heart of our vision, with the Cathedral as a beacon for this good news at the heart of the city and diocese.

This has encouraged us to reflect, with hope, upon our purpose in this generation. Rooted in our Vision (which we presented in 2022/3) and looking towards 2025 (the year in which we mark 950 years since the decision was made to establish a cathedral in Chichester, relocating the seat of the diocese from the town of Selsey) and beyond, we ask you to consider extending your support for the Cathedral's renewal:

1) Through making a donation – We ask for our congregation to make a gift through the Parish Giving Scheme – a simple and secure way for churches to receive gifts by Direct Debit, Credit and Debit Cards, Apple and Google Pay methods. As we approach 2025, you may wish to consider increasing your donation to £9.50 a week.

THE NICENE CREED



THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER



It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and Father, through Jesus Christ your Son. Through him you have created us in your own image, and made us stewards of your good creation. Through him you teach us to exult in the birds of the air, the lilies of the field, the precious and life-giving crops of the earth. Through him you free us from the slavery of sin, giving him to die upon the cross and to rise again for our salvation. Through him, you begin your work of new creation, as we look for a new heaven and a new earth in which your righteousness dwells. Therefore, we join with angels and archangels, and give voice to every creature under heaven, for ever praising you and singing:

The choir sings

SANCTUS AND BENEDICTUS

Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus Dominus Deus Sabaoth, pleni sunt caeli et terra gloria tua. Hosanna in excelsis. Benedictus qui venit in nomine Domini. Hosanna in excelsis. Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues:

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Deacon: Praise to you, Lord Jesus: Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Members of all Christian churches are welcome to receive communion if they wish. Please indicate if you wish to receive a gluten-free wafer. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please come to the communion station and bow your head.
